- reduce inequity in educational outcomes for learners by working with partners to improve achievement and raise attainment, particularly in literacy, numeracy and health and wellbeing
- collect and promote the use of international knowledge and research to provide clear, succinct advice for policymakers and practitioners

- countries' education systems, policy and political contexts;
- strengthen partnership working, including joint development activities, support and skills-sharing with British Council, SICI, CIDREE, OECD, the European and ICSEI
- promote awareness among education professionals of the opportunities for international learning and partnership, which leads to reflection and enquiry about differences in policy and practice
- formalise partnership working with the British Council, and agree a number of joint initiatives to support system improvement in Scotland and in a number of targeted countries.
- work with Scottish partners, including the General Teaching Council Scotland and the Scottish College for Educational Leadership, to share knowledge and develop effective programmes for international visitors



- work in collaboration with the SG International Development to support the delivery of national Statements of Intent, including agreements with Malawi, India and France.
- work key organisations, including British Council and other Scottish partners, to provide appropriate targeted educational support in identified priority countries, including Malawi, Zambia, Rwanda, Pakistan and a number of Indian jurisdictions;
- work with our Malawi government partners and the Scotland Malawi Partnership to plan and implement aspects of our five year cooperation agreement with the Government of the Republic of Malawi to support educational improvement and increase the life chances of children and young people; and
- consider commissions to improve key aspects of education in other countries and jurisdictions including approaches to inspection, undertaking joint reviews, and curriculum development and support.
